

Durham University Canoe Club Rules 2014/2015

No composite boats are to be used without permission from the Club Coach or the Captain. Permission may be given for multiple uses with any restrictions felt necessary. Restrictions may include but are not limited to use on white water (at all or above a certain grade) or use in competitions or training sessions of a particular nature.

All debts on club accounts must be paid off at the end of each term. If there is money owed on your account, the University will be made aware and you will be prevented from graduating.

Treat all kit with respect. If you misplace kit or mistreat it, causing in damage, you will be asked to replace or repair it.

You must fill out a Health and Safety Declaration and agree to these rules and the Health and Safety policy before partaking in any club event. The forms should be filled in online but limited paper copies will be available in the boathouse.

Club equipment should be put away after use and in the correct location. If you are not sure where something goes, please ask.

Lost, broken or damaged kit should be reported to the Kit Officer of your campus.

Under no circumstances should club trips go ahead until the designated river leader has sent a trip form to Team Durham. Should a trip form have not been sent to TD and club kit used then there will be a £20 fine.

Boathouse keys are available for drivers, kayakers who train regularly and coaches at Maiden Castle reception. Should you use this key please return it as soon as your session has finished. These keys must NOT leave the Maiden Castle compound.

University kit may be borrowed at the discretion of the exec. In this event a cheque should be written to the club beforehand, for the value of the kit borrowed which will be kept by the treasurer and cashed if and only if the kit is lost, or damaged to the point of needing replacement or repair.
